RANKING OF California EPPP TEST RESULTS**

PGSP Students Pass Test at Rate that is 25% Higher than Most Participants

Redwood City, Calif. (April, 2008) – The Pacific Graduate School of Psychology (PGSP), a private, independent professional school educating undergraduate and graduate students in the greater Bay Area, announced today the results from the 2007 Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP). The California EPPP licensing board scores reveal that PGSP, in comparison to 21 other institutions of higher education who had over eight individuals take the EPPP exam last year -- scored the second highest with a combined pass rate of 85.71% as contrasted with 59.49% for the group as a whole. Used widely by psychology licensing boards, the EPPP is intended as a generic test of knowledge deemed essential for practicing psychologists.

“The results on the EPPP attest to both the solid foundation in psychological science our students receive as well as the knowledge specific to clinical psychology,” said Allen Calvin, Ph.D, President of PGSP. “We are pleased that high pass rates are a general pattern at PGSP. They reflect very favorably on our outstanding students and faculty”

Working within a training model best described as "practitioner-scientist," PGSP students systematically move through five years of coursework and practica to acquire Ph.D.-level competence and capability in areas of psychological theory, research, and practice. PGSP students are taught to be science minded while appreciating the larger role of psychology in alleviating suffering in the world.
